










MOMENTUM: POLITICAL RECOGNITION AND REQUEST FOR WHO LEADERSHIP/COORDINATION

2021: UNGA adopts FIRST EVER RESOLUTION for drowning prevention (A/RES/75/273)

2023: WHA adopts FIRST EVER RESOLUTION for drowning prevention (WHA/76.18)

- Welcomes invitation to assist Member States with drowning prevention efforts, upon their request
- Accepts WHO coordination of drowning prevention within UN system, and to facilitate observance of WDPD
- Requests WHO to establish a global alliance for drowning prevention and prepare a global status report

Improve	Improve knowledge on the burden, context and impacts of drowning
Increase	Increase awareness and knowledge sharing on what works to prevent drowning
Strengthen	Strengthen national, regional and global coordination and partnerships for drowning prevention
Provide	Provide a tool for tracking progress in drowning prevention efforts over time
Support	Support the development of national strategies for drowning prevention which are evidence informed and respond to national priorities





Drowning in Europe

- 53 countries wide diversity of contexts
- 20x variation in mortality across the region:
 - 0.3 (Israel) 6.9 (Latvia)
- · Great reduction in childhood drowning
- European rates higher in older adults



Alcohol Attributable Fraction












Policy and legislation

Legislation for fencing around public swimming pools	14%	
Legislation for safety of passenger vessels	84%	
Legislation mandating lifejacket use	64%	
Alcohol regulations	12%
